Diamond Shape

Mont I: Students made colorful fish using diamond shaped cutouts and also brought diamond shaped food items to relate learning with fun. This simple activity helped them recognize the diamond shape while building fine motor skills and imagination. The little ones proudly displayed their colourful diamond shaped fish with big smiles.

Mont II: Little learners created colourful kites using the diamond shape, making shape recognition fun and engaging. As they colored and decorated their kites, children strengthened their fine motor skills and enjoyed a joyful hands-on learning experience. Their bright kites and brighter smiles made the activity truly delightful.

Mont III: Learners learned about the diamond (rhombus) shape and then drew objects that use that shape — such as earrings, pinwheels, kites and the diamond itself. This activity helped them recognize shapes in everyday items, practice fine motor skills through drawing and coloring, and express their own creativity.

SUBJECT ENRICHMENT


Math's – Number 6
