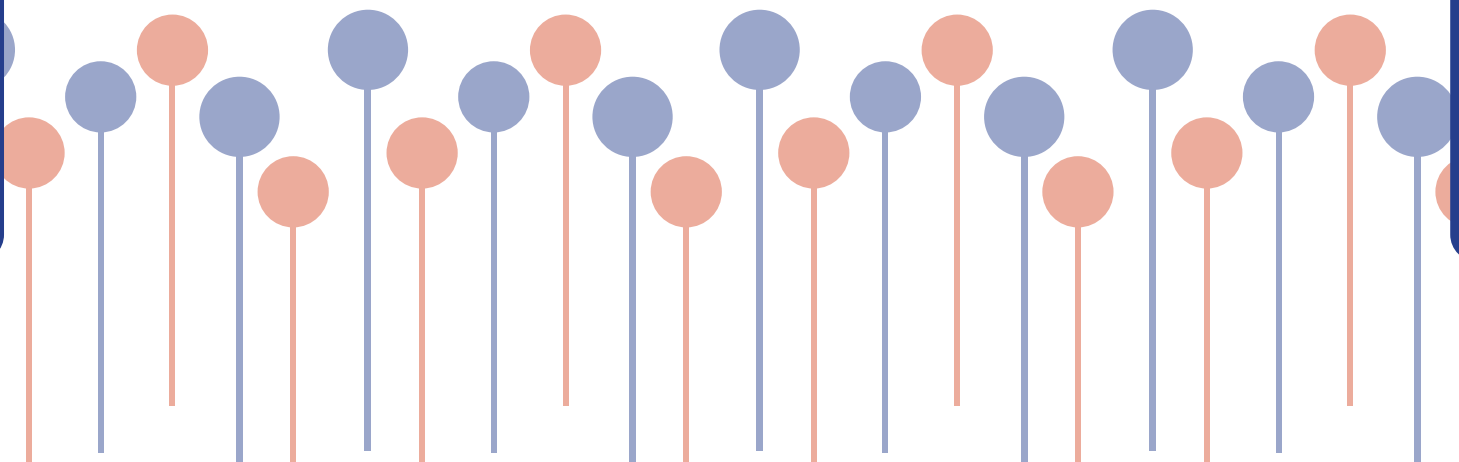

Doctor's Day – Honoring Our Everyday Heroes

Green Colour Day

During Green Colour Day, our little Ryanites had a wonderful opportunity to learn about and explore the colour green in a fun and engaging way. Children came dressed in green attire, which helped them associate the colour with everyday objects and develop an early understanding of colours around them.

The day featured a show-and-tell activity, where each child confidently shared objects, toys, or pictures that were green, enhancing their communication skills, observation, and confidence. In the classroom, children also coloured a caterpillar green, and participated in a creative Pea pod craft, which strengthened their fine motor skills, concentration, and creativity.

Through these activities, children connected learning with play, recognizing how colours appear in nature and in their surroundings. The combination of dressing up, hands-on crafts, and verbal expression made the learning experience joyful, interactive, and memorable, encouraging children to observe, express, and enjoy learning through creativity.



Environment Week

During Environmental Week, our little Ryanites explored and learned about nature, plants, animals, and the importance of keeping their surroundings clean. Through classroom discussions, storytelling, and simple activities, children were introduced to concepts like trees, water, air, and how animals and humans depend on nature.

They observed pictures, shared ideas, and participated in hands-on activities like coloring, drawing, and making crafts related to nature,

which helped them recognize different elements of the environment and express their thoughts creatively.

These activities encouraged children to ask questions, think about their surroundings, and develop an early sense of responsibility toward nature, while also enhancing their curiosity, imagination, and fine motor.

International Parents Day

During International Parents Day, parents were invited to the school to participate in enjoyable activities and friendly competitions, giving children the opportunity to observe, learn, and feel the joy of togetherness. By watching their parents engage in games, drama, and interactive tasks, children developed curiosity, social awareness, and an understanding of teamwork.

Through these experiences, children saw how collaboration, creativity, and problem-solving can be applied in real-life situations. They also learned the importance of family support and participation in school activities, which helps nurture confidence and a sense of belonging.

Even without active participation, children absorbed the excitement, observed role modeling, and connected classroom learning to life outside school, making the day both educational and memorable.

Counting the Objects Mont I

Our tiny tots had an exciting time learning numbers through a hands-on “Counting the Objects” activity. Children enthusiastically identified the numbers shown to them and

placed the correct number of objects on their counting mats. This fun-filled exercise helped them understand the concept of numbers and quantities in a concrete way.

Through this activity, children not only practiced number recognition and counting but also enhanced their fine motor skills, focus, and hand-eye coordination. Learning became joyful as they enjoyed touching, moving, and placing objects while connecting numbers to real quantities.

Body Parts and Their Uses Mont I

The Mont I children learnt about Body Parts and Their Uses through a fun and interactive flashcard activity. The teacher showed colorful flashcards of different body parts such as eyes, ears, nose, mouth, hands, legs, and head. Each body part was explained with its function in a simple way that children could easily understand. The children enthusiastically identified each body part and shared what they could do with it — like seeing with eyes, hearing with ears, smelling with the nose, eating and speaking with the mouth, holding and clapping with hands, and walking or jumping with legs. Through this activity, children developed their vocabulary, listening, and observation skills. The use of flashcards made the learning more visual and enjoyable. It also helped the young learners understand how every part of the body is important and helps us in our daily life.

Shapes Activity

Our curious Mont II learners had an exciting time exploring different shapes through a fun-filled hands-on activity!

Children identified and sorted shapes like circle, square, triangle, and rectangle using colorful cutouts and classroom objects.

This engaging activity helped them develop their visual recognition, fine motor skills, and spatial awareness while learning to observe shapes in their surroundings.

The little ones enjoyed tracing, matching, and naming each shape with enthusiasm, turning learning into a joyful experience!



Heavy and Light Activity

Our little Mont III learners enthusiastically participated in a fun-filled hands-on activity to understand the concept of heavy and light weight. Using everyday classroom objects like books and bottles, children explored, compared, and identified which items are heavy and which are light.

This engaging activity not only helped them develop their thinking and observation skills but also encouraged active participation and practical learning. Through touching, lifting, and comparing objects, the tiny tots learned an important early math concept in a joyful and interactive way!



National Symbols - Explained - Mont III

The Mont III students participated in an interactive panel board activity on the topic “National Symbols of India.” The children confidently came forward to explain the different national symbols displayed on the colorful panel board. They spoke about the National Flag - the Tricolour, representing courage, peace, and prosperity; the National Animal - Tiger, known for its strength and power; the National Bird - Peacock, symbolizing beauty and grace; the National Flower - Lotus, representing purity; and the National Tree - Banyan Tree, symbolizing longevity and shelter. Students also learned about the National Fruit - Mango, National Game - Hockey, and National Emblem - Ashoka Chakra, which stands for truth and courage.

Through this panel board presentation, children enhanced their speaking and observation skills, gained confidence in public expression, and understood the importance of these symbols that represent our country's pride and heritage. The vibrant visuals and active participation made the session both educational and enjoyable, helping young learners build respect and love for their nation.



Health Check-Up Camp

A Health Check-up Camp was organized for the Preprimary students, where a team of experienced doctors visited the school to examine the children's overall health. The doctors conducted a thorough dental check-up, checking each child's teeth and guiding them on how to keep their teeth clean and healthy. They also checked the pulse rate, height, weight, and eyes of the students to ensure proper growth and development. The little ones eagerly participated in the camp and interacted confidently with the doctors. This activity helped in creating health awareness among young children and encouraged them to develop good hygiene and healthy habits. The check-up camp was a great initiative by the school to ensure that every child stays healthy, happy, and active.

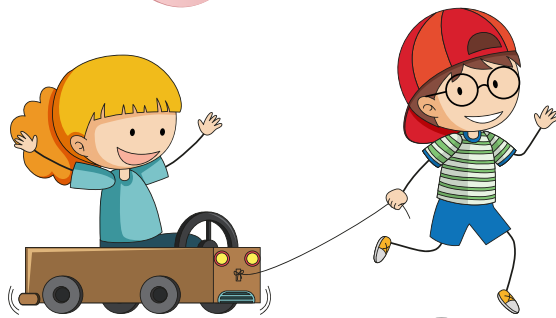


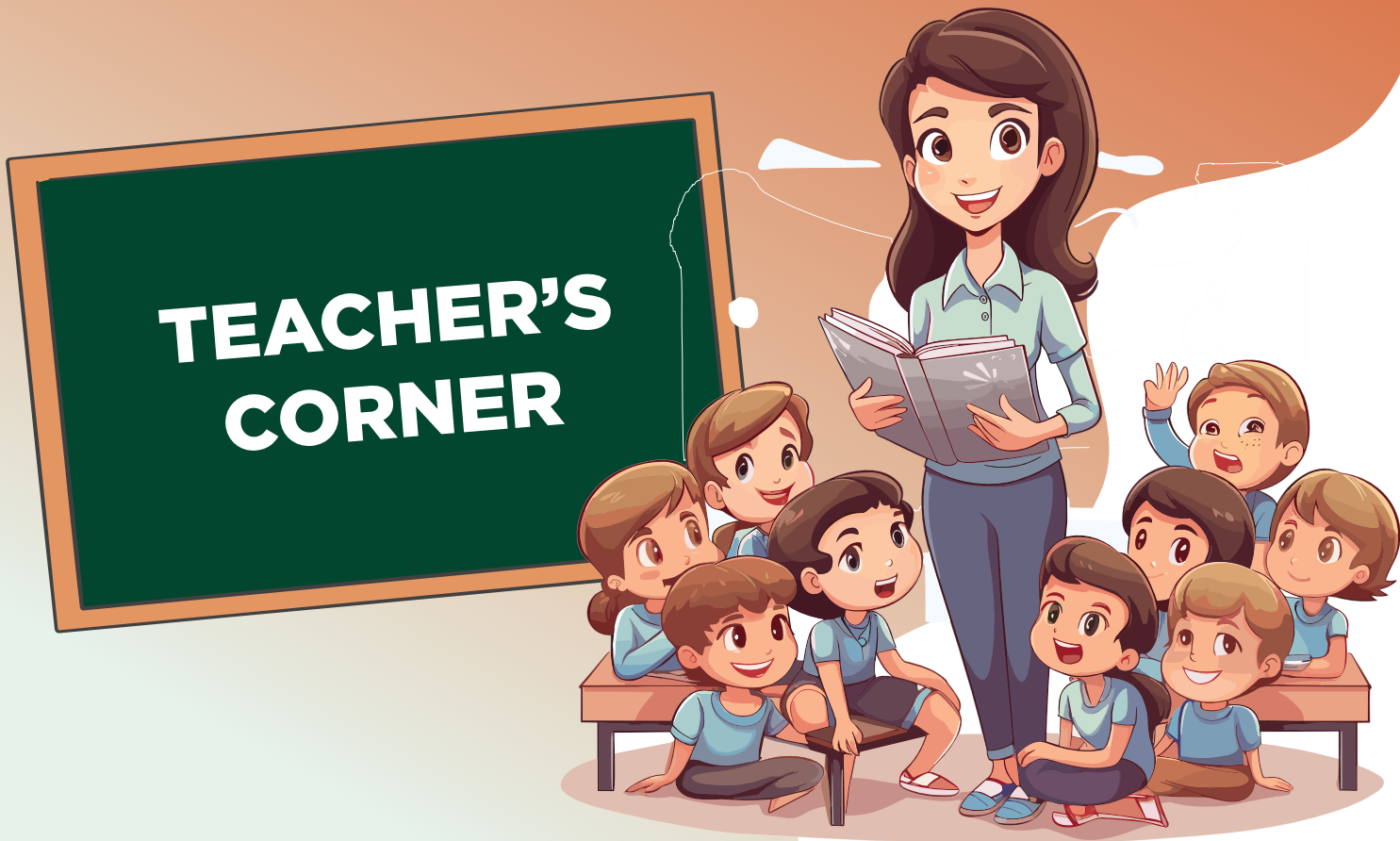
STUDENT CORNER

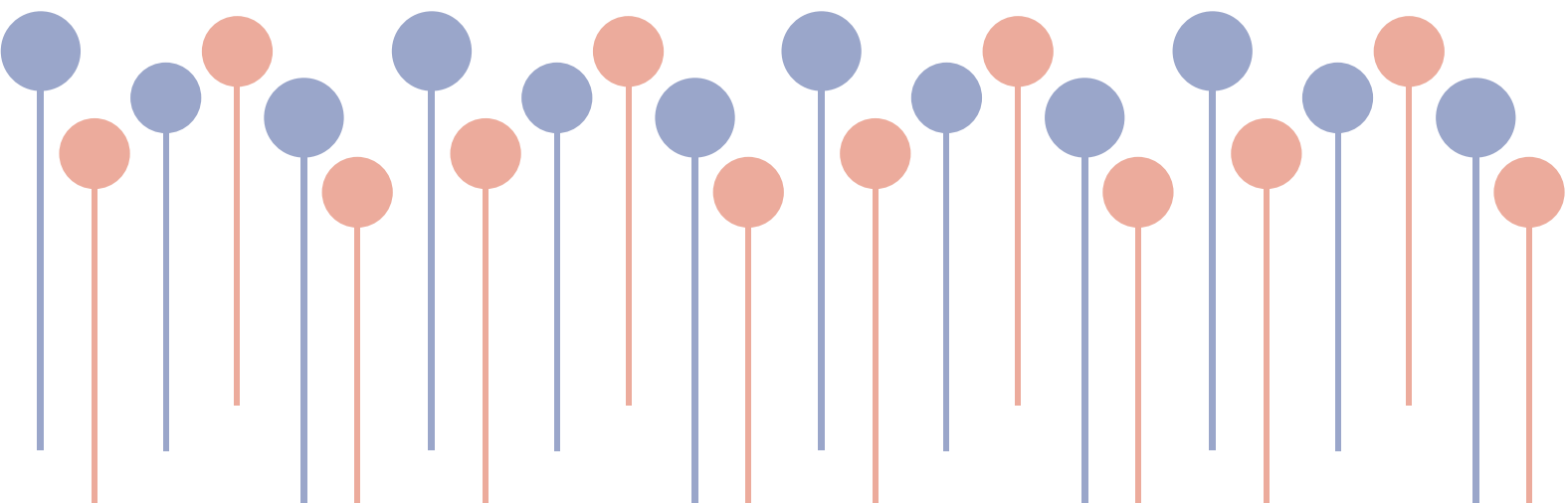
