


From the Principal's Desk

Introduction to Magnets, Classification of Magnetic and Non-magnetic Objects

This project report presents the design, implementation, and evaluation of a hands-on activity developed to introduce Montessori-grade students to the fundamental concepts of magnetism. The activity featured an interactive learning station where students engaged in exploring the properties of magnets by testing and classifying everyday objects as either "magnetic" or "non-magnetic." Through this approach, the project successfully encouraged curiosity, enhanced observation skills, and promoted early scientific inquiry. It provided young learners with an age-appropriate introduction to a core concept in physics, laying a strong foundation for future science learning.

Magnet Car Activity

This project report outlines a STEM activity designed to introduce students to the concepts of magnetism, force, and motion through the creation and operation of a simple magnetic car. In this hands-on and engaging experience, students explored how magnetic poles interact and how the principles of magnetic attraction and repulsion can be harnessed to generate motion without direct physical contact between components. By designing and assembling a lightweight car powered by magnets, learners not only gained a foundational understanding of key physics concepts but also enhanced their creativity problem-solving abilities through and practical application.
