### Pellet Drum

Children created their own pellet drums by decorating circular card pieces, which were fixed onto sticks with strings and pellets attached on both sides. This short, hands-on activity enhanced fine motor skills, creativity, and an early sense of beat and tempo, while introducing children to simple musical instruments in a joyful way.






## PARENT'S CORNER
