### CLASSROOM ACTIVITY

#### **Emotions - Mont II**

This month, our Mont II learners explored the theme of emotions through fun and engaging activities. Children learned to identify and express different feelings such as happiness, sadness, anger, and surprise using art. They enjoyed making expressive faces with emoji mask, which helped them understand that it's okay to feel different emotions and share with others. activities them These encouraged empathy, self-awareness, and positive communication, building a strong foundation for their social and emotional development.





## **ACTIVITIES**

#### **My Family - Mont II**

In Mont II, children celebrated the theme of 'My Family' with a creative and joyful activity. The little ones dipped their hands in green paint to make lovely handprints on paper, symbolizing love and togetherness. They then added their family photo in the center, turning it into a special keepsake that reflected their bond at home. This activity not only enhanced their fine motor skills but also helped them value the importance of family and the love and care they receive every day.



Mont III students had an exciting learning the "AP" word family through hands-on phonics activities. Using a special wooden word tool, children practiced blending sounds to form simple words like cap, map, nap, and tap. This interactive tool allowed them to slide and change letters, helping them understand how new words are formed by changing just one sound. The activity made learning fun and engaging, while also building early reading, pronunciation, and word recognition skills. It was a joyful and meaningful way to strengthen their phonics foundation through play-based learning.

#### **Sense Organs - Mont III**

Our Mont III students learned about the five sense organs through an interactive and creative activity. Each child was given a blank face outline and a set of cut-out sense organs—eyes, ears, nose, mouth, and hands. As they carefully stuck each organ in its correct place, they learned about its function and how we use it to see, hear, smell, taste, and touch. This hands-on activity helped reinforce the concept in a fun and memorable way, while also supporting fine motor skills and body awareness.









## SCIENCE EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

## Water Ecosystem - 3D Printed Aquatic Animal Display - Mont III

Our children of Mont III explored the components of a water ecosystem, including various aquatic animals, plants, and their interdependence. They observed and interacted with 3D printed models of water animals to understand their unique features, habitats, and roles in the ecosystem and enhanced environmental awareness, curiosity, and visual learning by engaging with physical representations of aquatic life. This activity strengthens observation and discussion skills by identifying and describing the functions of different organisms within the water ecosystem.



Our students of Mont III participated in an engaging hands-on activity to learn about sail boats. Using materials like EVA foam sheet (for the boat base), corrugated sheet (for the sail), and nuts and bolts (to fix the sail), children created their own floating sail boats. activity. students Through this were introduced to the concept of floating objects and movement in water. They enjoyed placing their sail boats in a water tub and watching them float. The session sparked their curiosity helped develop fine motor skills, and early science creativity. awareness through play and observation.






