Teachers Day

Indian Airforce Day

Indian Air Force Day is celebrated annually on 8th October to commemorate the establishment and achievements of the Indian Air Force. This significant day marks the founding of the IAF in 1932 and highlights its crucial role in safeguarding the nation's airspace and supporting ground operations. To mark this occasion, the school conducted a Paper Jet Making activity for Montessori students on 13th October. The young learners enthusiastically created paper jets using different coloured papers, making the celebration both educational and enjoyable.

Global Handwash Day

Global Handwash Day, observed on 15th October, emphasizes the importance of proper hand hygiene in maintaining good health. To mark this day, the school conducted a demonstration and role-play activity for Montessori students, where teachers explained and demonstrated the correct steps of hand-washing—wet, lather, rinse, and dry. The day was filled with fun and engaging activities such as paper tearing, finger print and fork print art, and cotton ball activities. These hands-on experiences helped children develop fine motor skills, improve hand-eye coordination, enhance sensory awareness, and encourage creativity through exploration of textures, patterns, and colours.

Electromagnetic Crane

This project, "Festive Card with LED", was made to show how a greeting card can light up with a small bulb (LED). Students used copper tape, a battery, and a press point to complete the circuit. When they pressed on the switch point, the LED glowed and made the card look bright and festive. This activity helped children learn that electricity

flows in a closed path and can be used in creative ways.

Parrot in a Cage

This project introduces Mont III children to living things and mechanical movement by creating a working model of a parrot inside a cage. The students used simple classroom materials like cardboard, wooden sticks, colored paper, and a small electric motor to design a cage with a parrot that can move. When powered by a battery, the parrot swings or rotates gently inside its cage, showing how machines can make objects move and how cages keep birds safe.








PARENT'S CORNER
