

3rd June , World Bicycle Day (will be conducted on 6th June)

The United Nations General Assembly declared 3 June as World Bicycle Day acknowledging the individuality, durability and versatility of the bicycle, which have been in use for 2 centuries. The first bike was actually called a *celerifere*; it was invented in 1790 by **Comte Mede de Sivrac** of France. This was a wooden figure that didn't have handles, pedals, or any features we now associate with bikes.

World Environment Day is a global platform for public outreach, with participation from over 143 countries annually.

The international day supports the implementation of worldwide Sustainable Development and fosters public interest in the protection of the ocean and the sustainable management of its resources.

21st June - World Music Day

The first World Music Day was observed and celebrated on the Summer Solstice in France in the year 1982 when the former French minister of art and culture, Jack Lange, along with Maurice Fleuret started the Fête de la Musique in Paris. That is also why World Music Day is alternatively known as Fête de la Musique.

Fleuret, who initiated and organised this day for music and its lovers, was aFrench composer, music journalist, and radio producer. From then on, music and its importance became more known across the globe.

23rd June - International Olympic Day

Overview: The rings are five interlocking rings, colored blue, yellow, black, green and red on a white field, known as the "Olympic rings". The symbol was originally created in 1913 by Coubertin. He appears to have intended the rings to represent the five

continents: Europe, Africa, Asia, America, and Oceania.

The modern tradition of moving the Olympic flame via a relay system from Greece to the Olympic venue began with the Berlin Games in 1936. The Olympic torch is carried by athletes, leaders, celebrities, and ordinary people alike, and at times in unusual conditions.
