Quality Circle Time

Growth in academics is a result of the multiple opportunities provided in school for upgradation of skills and knowledge. To enhance language skills the Quality Circle Time is introduced where every individual engages with skills of creative expression.

To help students improve their language proficiency, Ryan International Academy, Bavdhan, Pune has its own uniquely designed skill activity where stem sentences are given as part of the weekly activity 'Quality Circle Time'. 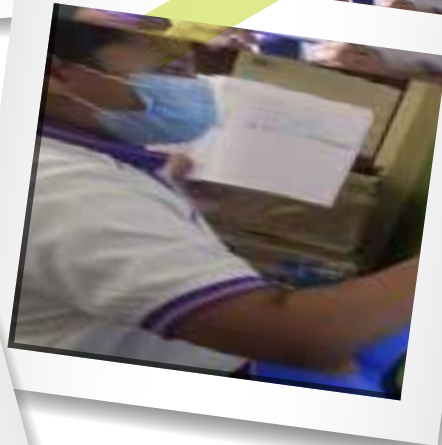
With the help of these stem sentences we provide our learners with scaffolding.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME

English is the most commonly spoken language around the world. It is the language that encompasses science, technology and business globally. By learning English, one can develop their communication skills and general language competency. To promote the importance of the language, an English Language Enrichment program is initiated.

Under this program, the students from grades I to VIII have given the pre-test so that their competency can be identified and they can learn more to acquire language skills. They also have Word of the Day which they use every day to frame sentences. The students who use the maximum number of words are awarded with tokens at the end of the month. They also have ELEP periods in which they become familiar with different activities like Dictogloss text on Myself and My Family, Fill in the missing words, Greetings and introducing self, Ten Questions, adjective crossword, Picture description, situation based responses, describing people, debate, for language enrichment. This practice will open doors to a world of opportunities, leading to better performance and career advancement.

Activities

Innovation Academy

The mission of the innovation academy is to cultivate innovators who are ready to leverage disruptive change in every individual. Here, every individual makes the change happen through imagination and creation. The educator helps the students to become independent entrepreneurs that reinvent the way things are done. The activities like making and working of gliders, model making of hydraulic suspension bridge, float sinking, model making of water pump and air pump, air balloon, model of magnetic car etc were the most interesting sessions which students were involved with.

Sports

An activity involves physical exertion and skill in which an individual or team competes against another or others for entertainment. Many sports like badminton, basketball, futsal, skating, cricket make our children play in a lively and energetic way.

The students eagerly wait for the sport activities as it increases the kinesthetic skill in them. The students were imparted with the importance of a balanced diet. They learnt the rules of each sport. They learnt the skills of cricket such as back move, front move, running, fielding, holding the bat by practising with the equipment. They learnt dribbling the ball in possession and maintaining control too.

Passion Building

A passion gives us a reason to keep learning and to work toward mastery. Keeping this in view the school has initiated different passion building activities such as Home Science, Revival of Lost Art, and Eco-Awareness.



Activities

Home Science

This club focuses on maintaining different etiquettes and manners. The students had an introduction session of home science followed by some activities related to personal hygiene. They also learnt about different ways to maintain food and water hygiene through a variety of activities such as chart preparation, role play, group discussion and quiz. They analysed the video based on food and water hygiene and also discussed the nutritional values of food. They were imparted with the 'small group simulation' activity where they learnt about the importance of maintaining personal hygiene.



Revival of Lost Art

The world in which we reside today has become an infinite arena for increasing technology and urbanization. We have entered into the rat-race of establishment and have forgotten the cultural heritage of our nation. Students are taught to imbibe into themselves and value the spirit of the nation. The students got an introduction to Warli Art. They also learnt drawing of borders, basic shapes of human figures, types of animals and types of trees. The students learnt to draw village scene on black tinted paper, colouring with white poster colour, village wedding scene on yellow tinted paper, colouring with brown poster colour, circle of warli human figures (people are dancing in the circle).



Eco - Awareness

This club focuses more on the eagerness to preserve the natural resources which are essential for the survival of mother nature. They had a nature walk where they appreciated the beauty of nature and had the urge of making it a better place to survive. They were imbibed with different activities such as street play, mono act, role play and poster designing to spread the awareness of a clean and healthy environment. They too shared their observations on the causes of different types of pollution through leaf collage, skit presentation, debate, group discussions and poster making.



Activities

Vocational Initiatives

Vocational classes Viz French language, Helen-O-Grady Drama and Speech and Coding are successfully a prominent part of learning where each child learns under the same roof of the school as per his/her interest. Apart from adapting to new skills, vocational training also aids in upgradation of the skills for every individual.

Helen-O-Grady

The students are prepared to present themselves by giving the introduction through a speech with proper expression. They learnt by doing the controlled movement mime to music with examples to enable students with the best presentation skill. They too performed on The GoodBye song which was taken as the snippet and "No Meat For Me Thanks" was used as the improvisation of the class.

Coding

The students learnt through applying analytical thinking. The activities like Algorithm, Numeral system, binary games are an integral part of the coding class. This class provides an immense exposure to brainstorming and logistic applications.

French Language

This initiative is conducted with lots of activities like learning the days of the week and month through songs in French; how to introduce yourself; numbers counting, etc. While learning and doing these activities students get to identify the new expressions used to introduce oneself through an audio. This initiative helps students to become smart and a creative personality.

"We read to know we are not alone".

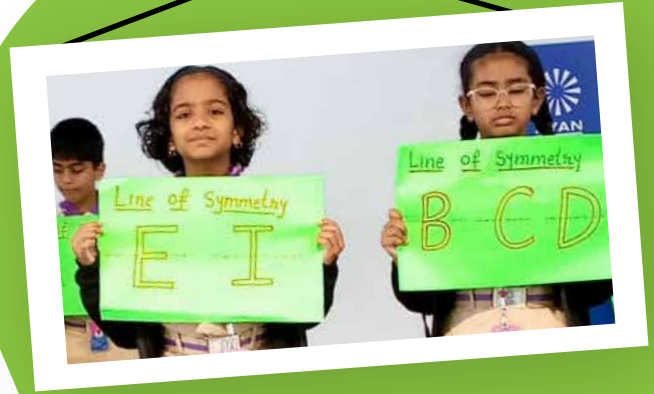

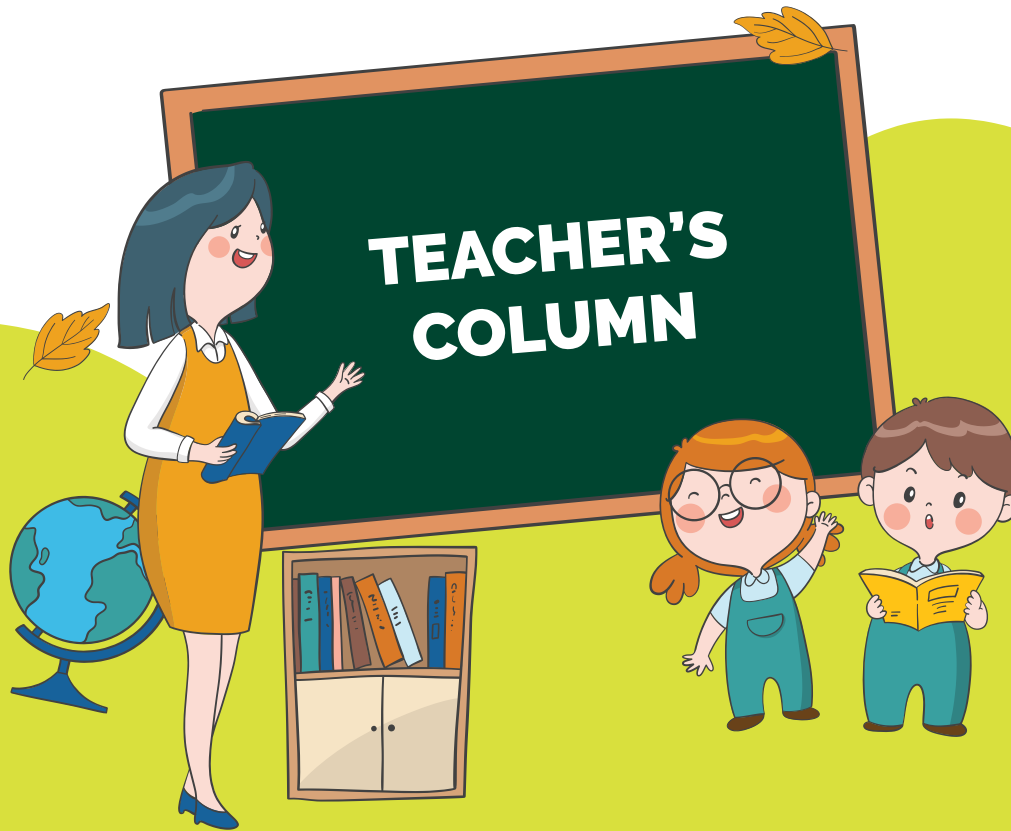
HSCP Training

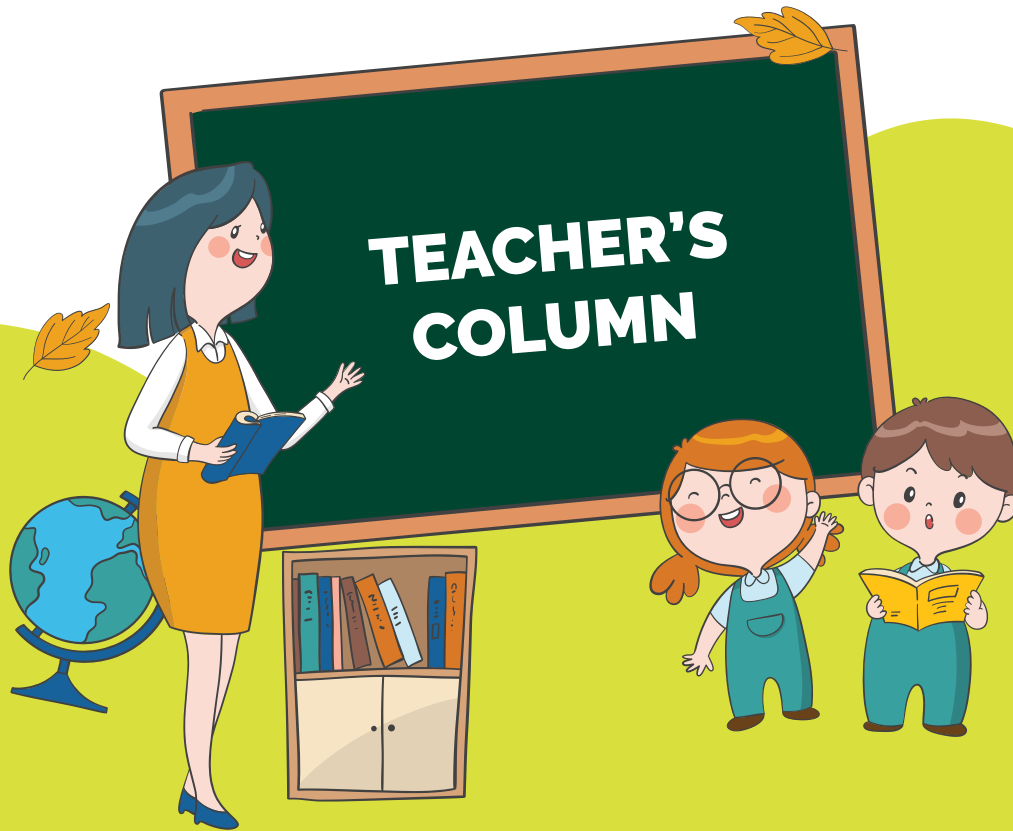
Workshops for teachers helps to plan their time better and stay organised. This makes teachers more productive and gives them more time to focus on each student. Great teachers help create great students.
